

Program Updates

Pregnancy & Parenting Support

Keeping Families Connected

In 2024, Good Shepherd's Pregnancy and Parenting Support Program served 279 families and completed over 2,500 home visits. We also expanded our reach by adding an additional two employees to help us serve our southern-most counites. As an example of the great work that we do, Good Shepherd, recently gave substantial support to a homeless mother who was pregnant and had a young child with autism. Good Shepherd helped this family find stability, a source of income, and housing placement. Ultimately, when this client found housing, Good Shepherd helped with the first month's rent. Mom was able to obtain some financial stability, and this reduced her stress levels, allowing her to deliver a healthy baby girl. Good Shepherd's PPS Program still supports this family today.

Maternity

Connecting with Young Moms

This past season has brought beautiful signs of hope and healing at our Maternity & Transitional Living Shelter for homeless mothers and their babies. Several young women have taken brave steps toward reconnecting with family members, this time in healthier, more supportive ways. A few have even made the exciting transition into their own stable housing, beginning a new chapter of independence alongside their little ones.

We are thrilled to share that every mother currently in the shelter has begun either working or is attending school—a powerful testament to their resilience and determination. Whether it's balancing class schedules or navigating work schedules along with regularly occuring night feedings, these mothers are rising to meet the moment with strength and grace.

Through every hardship and moment of uncertainty, the spirit of Maternity continues to shine. Thank you for being part of our mission that helps new life flourish—in more ways than one.



Adoption

Connecting Children with Families

The Good Shepherd Adoption Team had a busy 2024, facilitating eight placements for nine children (ranging in age from newborn to 2 ½ years old). The start to 2025 has already brought three adoption placements in just the month of January. We recently welcomed a new adoption specialist to our team, Elizabeth Titius. She holds a master's in social work and has jumped right into supporting families on their exciting adoption journeys. Recently, Katy Stern, our birth parent specialist, invited Good Shepherd birth mothers who have made an adoption plan for their children to a new, virtual birth mother support group. This was a beautiful event where birth mothers were able to receive support, communicate openly, and work through some of their challenges. We are beyond grateful for your support and prayers!

Foster Care

Expanded Presence in Jefferson County

Foster Care has been busy over the last several months launching our newest location in Hillsboro, MO. On December 5, we welcomed the community at our open house where we did a ribbon cutting with the Hillsboro Chamber of Commerce. We had over 100 community members come through our new offices and shared stories of the buildings history as we discussed the impact we are making for our community. Our foster care, treatment foster care, and pregnancy & parenting support programs now have a physical presence in Jefferson County where we can host meetings, trainings, and family visits.
